

I have to confess I began our trip to Cuba with you with some trepidation; I thought the cost was pricey, I worried about plane connections, the harassment of jinteros, and the near certainty of returning home with dengue fever. I'm now happy to say that I find every one of these concerns laughable. The trip was worth every penny, the planes flew on time, the Cubans we met were to a man and woman courteous, and I feel bronzed, fit, and in love with Cuba. You are a magician. You were our Virgil in Purgatorio, en route to Paradiso, as we dearly hope, for Cuba.

You do deserve a hat's-off, chapeau, well done. Your plan was so imaginatively thought through and done with such efficiency that it all now seems a bit of a miracle. The events you designed were fascinating without a single lowering of intensity or charm. If I begin to single out occasions, I would have to reproduce our entire itinerary. Still, some stand out from the others just a little (with no discourtesy intended to those I don't mention): the lecture about Cuba by Marc Frank was wonderfully illuminating and engaging, and the lecture by the architect Pedro Vazquez equally fine. The music at the Café Madrigal with Frank Delgado was brilliant; even more brilliant (can this be?) was the performance unrolling the history of music by Alberto Faya (what a voice!). I loved our visit to the home of the two young women of Reina y Real determined to be hip-hop stars (what an original idea to visit them!), and we loved staying at the elegant casa particular in Trinidad with Deborah and José. (We had a marvelous time driving in a 1957 Fairline Ford with the very amiable Jorge Palmiero to the beach at Ancón and into the Valley of the Sugar Mills.)

All throughout we found the Cubans to be friendly and courteous as if they grew up with the morality of a different planet: you will not be greeted with such smiles and the suggestion of friendship and respect in our madly wired urban centers at home. Since I am writing this report to honor you, Charles, the mastermind of the excursion, I must conclude with your finest achievement: on the strength of your many friendships in Cuba, you brought us Christopher our guide; he was a master of clear information (about everything!) and a diplomatic way of presenting Cuban history, specially its tormented relations with the US, that respected the complexity of the matter but without polemical drama. The trip was memorable, and Regine, my wife, and I thank you for your brilliant administration.

The most important feature of the trip is the extraordinary set of human relationships that Charles Bittner has established and maintains throughout the city of Havana. He is clearly respected and beloved everywhere he goes, and with reason. He has a classically New York personal style, a tough-minded and wide-ranging knowledge of the culture and the history, an absolute willingness to help manage awkward intercultural exchanges (helping negotiate between an artist and a prospective buyer-me!), and a gentle consideration and kindness, that combined to make the trip a joy from beginning to end. He was throughout thoughtful and obliging (creating a last-minute trip to the Buena Vista Social Club for those who wanted it). I did not envy his job; I literally couldn't do it. But I am so grateful that he created this trip and cannot imagine anyone else having the combination of characteristics that he brings to it.

The specific experiences that were set up for us—ranging from scholarly lectures from a wide range of brilliant and generous academics (on architecture, art, music, economics, gender—an interdisciplinary education in a week!), to musical performances of three completely different genres of Cuban music, to meetings with artists and dancers—not to mention visits to an organic vegetable farm and restaurant and a tobacco farm! I cannot recall a week in my adult life when I learned more faster—or so enjoyably. Moreover, it has awakened in me a desire to learn more, and to go back.

Finally, there was in addition all kinds of attention to our comfort and first-world needs in a poor country. He has a great sense of humor and projects great calm, courtesy and genuine enjoyment of the range of human beings in the world.

Charles is a treasure and made this trip a joy from beginning to end.
